Global Responsibility Week 2023 - Net Zero Transitions

Nottingham Business School (NBS) at Nottingham Trent University will be holding its annual 'Global Responsibility Week' during the week commencing 2nd May 2023 and we would very much appreciate it if you or members of your faculty would consider taking part.

We are particularly interested in how business can rise to the challenge of transitioning to net zero. This will require effective leadership in achievement of the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) alongside ambitious plans for developing sustainability strategies, embedding sustainability in value chains, supporting sustainable innovation and technology, developing sustainable customer experience and brands, working with wider stakeholders, improving sustainability reporting and engaging investors in implementation. We would welcome proposals which develop our students' understanding of and sensitivity to these challenges as they enter a world in which businesses worldwide have committed to the UN's Business Ambition for 1.5°C.

Global Responsibility Week - 2nd to 4th May 2023

Expenses Policy

All parties must complete an expenses' claim form and provide copies of receipts to claim a refund of expenses.

Visa Costs

All parties are required to apply and purchase their own visa. NBS will refund visa costs up to £100.

Air Travel to the UK

NBS will refund a return economy air ticket and this cannot exceed:

- £1000 for international travel
- £500 for European travel

Travel from Airport to Nottingham:

NBS will only be able to refund internal UK travel using public transport.

Rail Travel

The cost of rail travel must not exceed the price of a standard class return for the journey.

NBS will only refund return rail travel from a UK airport to Nottingham. (www.trainline.com or www.eastmidlandsrailway.co.uk)

Bus Travel

The cost of bus travel must not exceed the price of a standard class return for the journey

NBS will only refund return bus travel from a UK airport to Nottingham. (https://www.nationalexpress.com/en)

Travel in Nottingham

<u>Tram</u>

There is a tram service from the Nottingham Train Station and Bus Station that has a stop outside of the Nottingham Hotel.

Meals, Accommodation and Social Events

Meals

NBS will provide Lunch on the days of the Global Responsibility Week 5 – 7 April 2022. An evening meal will be provided on Wednesday 6th April 2022.

Meals taken outside of these including one day of travel either side will be refunded. Maximum £30 per day including Monday 4^{th} April to Friday 7^{th} April only.

Accommodation

NBS will arrange (book and pay for) a single occupancy room in a local hotel, this will be bed & Breakfast for a total of 4 nights, arriving Monday 1st May 2023 and departing Friday 5th May 2023.
